Church of Scientology Nashville Launches its 2012 Seminar Program

The Church of Scientology & Celebrity Centre Nashville opens its new industry seminar series this weekend, with Tony Harnell presenting an inside look into lasting success in entertainment. The seminar will take place January 28 at the Church—1130 8th Avenue South.

Harnell, a recording artist, songwriter and producer, best known as front man for the Norwegian rock band TNT for 23 years. Visual artist A.D. Maddox's April 14 seminar is the "precise answer to marketing and publicity in visual arts." Maddox is a world-renowned artist, featured in *Gray's Sporting Journal*, *American Angler*, *Big Sky Journal*, *The Contemporary Sportsman*, and *Wild on the Fly*.
